Answer the following question:

Many Americans believe that volunteering is a part of being a good **citizen**. What do you think?

Some **organizations** are **non-profit**. We also call them **not-for-profit**. Some examples of non-profit organizations are hospitals, churches, and organizations that help people who need help. These organizations do NOT make money for their owners.

People and businesses **contribute** money to non-profit organizations. Sometimes the government also gives money to non-profit organizations to do their work. Americans contribute money to non-profit organizations because they want to help people.

Americans also **volunteer** time and skills to help people. A **volunteer** is a person who gives time and skills and does not get paid money. Most non-profit organizations have **employees** and volunteers. The only difference between an employee and a volunteer is that the employee earns money and the volunteer does not. There are many non-profit organizations in Flagstaff, like LVCC.

Have you ever thought about volunteering? LVCC needs volunteers for all types of jobs, like helping with events, speaking in public and calling other learners. Let us know if you want to help out. 556-0313.
