## How Do I Get a Library Card?

The library will give a borrower card to permanent residents of Coconino County (who are at least 18 years old) for a period of one year. Library cards are issued at the Circulation Desk. You will need to have the following to get a card:

- A current Arizona state issued I.D. with name, address and picture (or valid Federal Military license) (must be the original I.D., not a photocopy)
- Proof of a local mailing address (examples: Utility bill, checkbook with a current address or envelope with a current postmark)
- Be a resident of Coconino County for at least three months

People who do not have the required identification may still get a library card by completing a *Borrower Application Exception form*. The librarian can help you with this form.

When you receive your card, you will need to decide on a PIN number. Now you are ready to check out books and use the library computers for free! If you have questions, call the Library at (928) 779-7670 or ask a staff member the next time you visit the Flagstaff Public Library.
